Spring is coming!



The first Brownsville dock was built in 1901 by community donated work and continued to be kept up by community effort until the Brownsville Port District was formed by special election. The first Commissioners were E. L. Walker, G. G. Wagner, and E. Ekstedt.

All marina tenants and moorage customers are issued the Marina Regulations by the Port of Brownsville. These are the written guidelines and rules regarding moorage, dock usage and many other key rules. These guidelines are to be followed and complied with as a condition to become a tenant and remain a tenant. These rules include everything related to insurance coverage, payments, delinquency in the vessel or account and more. Those tenants not in compliance of these Port Regulations will be notified and given notice of termination of their moorage agreement if regulations are not met in a timely manner.
